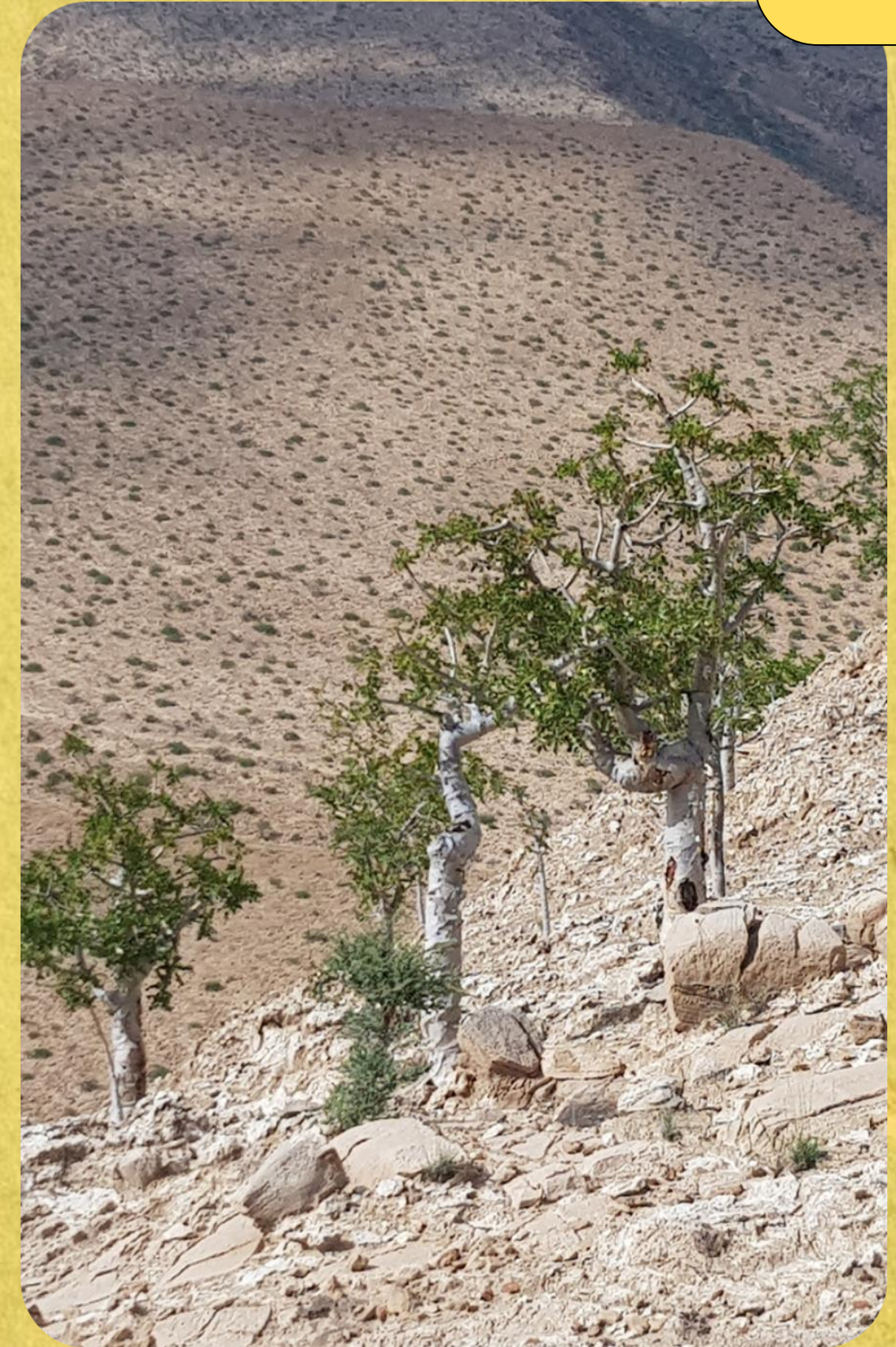

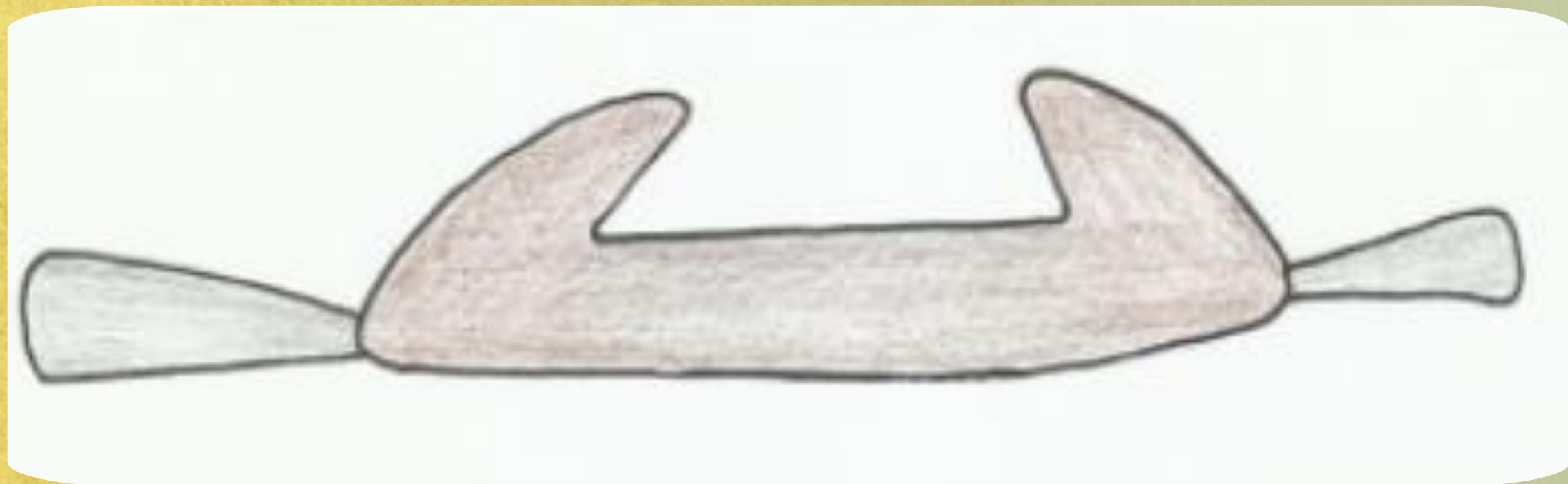
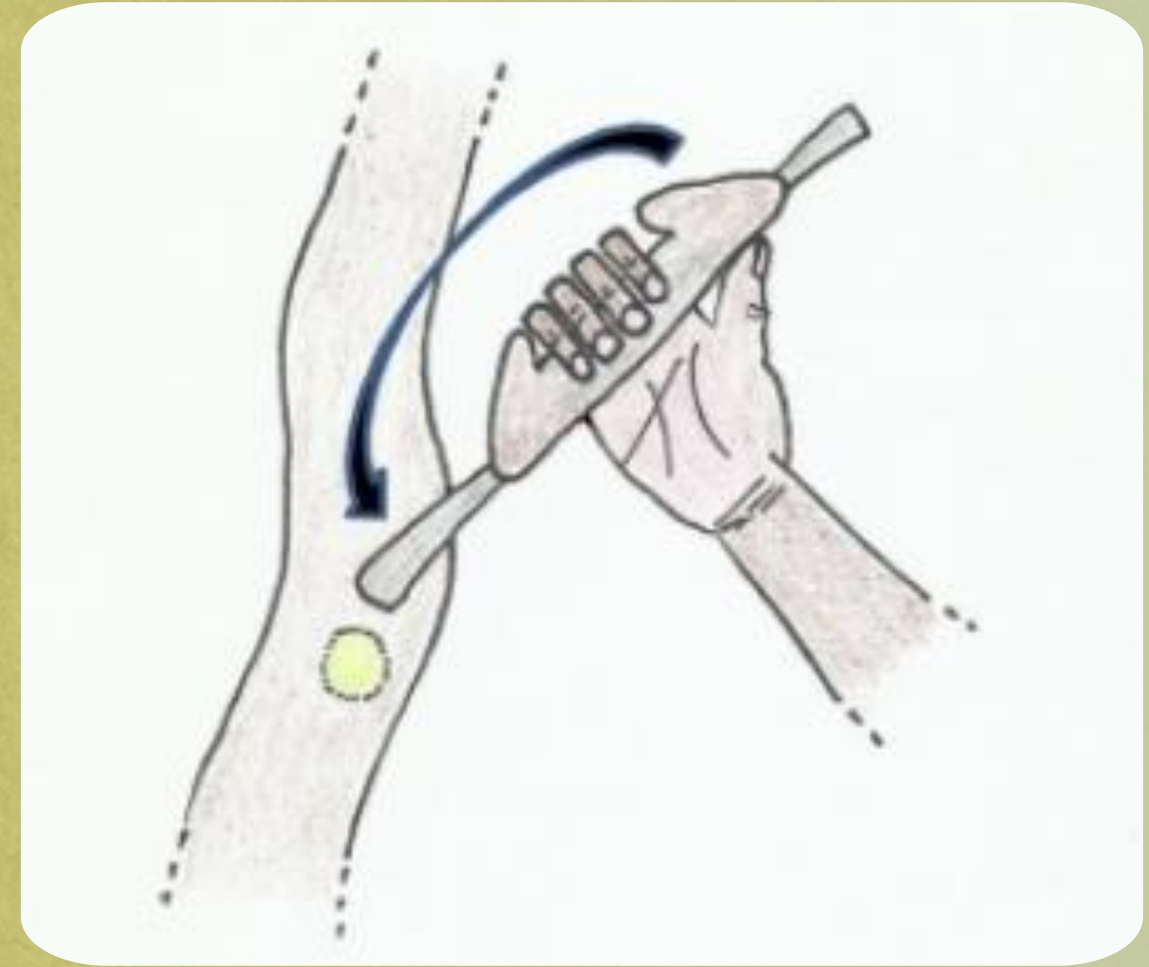

Training - Tapping tools



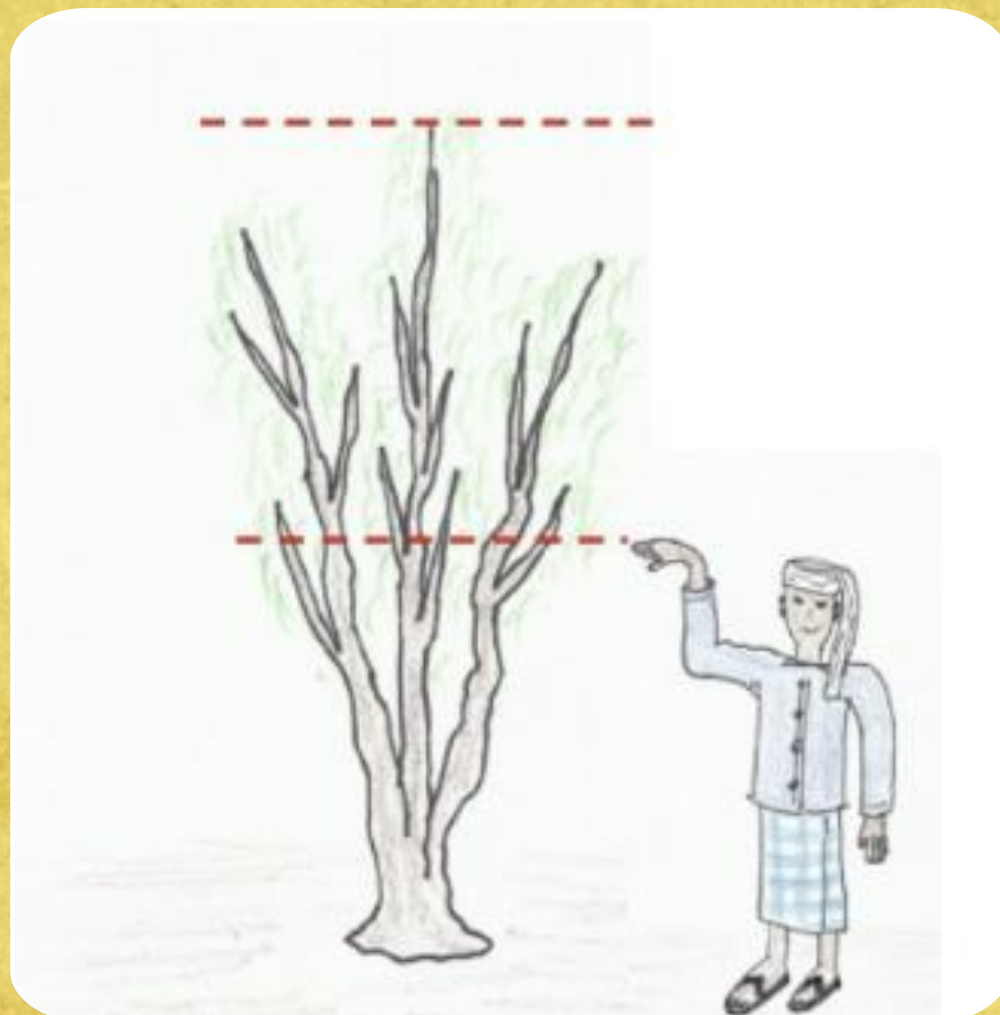
**DID YOU KNOW?****Harvesting Process:**

The resin is harvested by making shavings in the bark of Boswellia trees. The trees then secrete a milky white sap that hardens into resin. Harvesting is a skilled process and is done at the peak of the long, hot and dry season.

Training - Rotation tapping



At what age should the tree be pruned?

The growth of frankincense is slow. The tree can be pruned when it reaches a height of about 3 meters and is around 10 years old.



Should the tree be pruned every year?

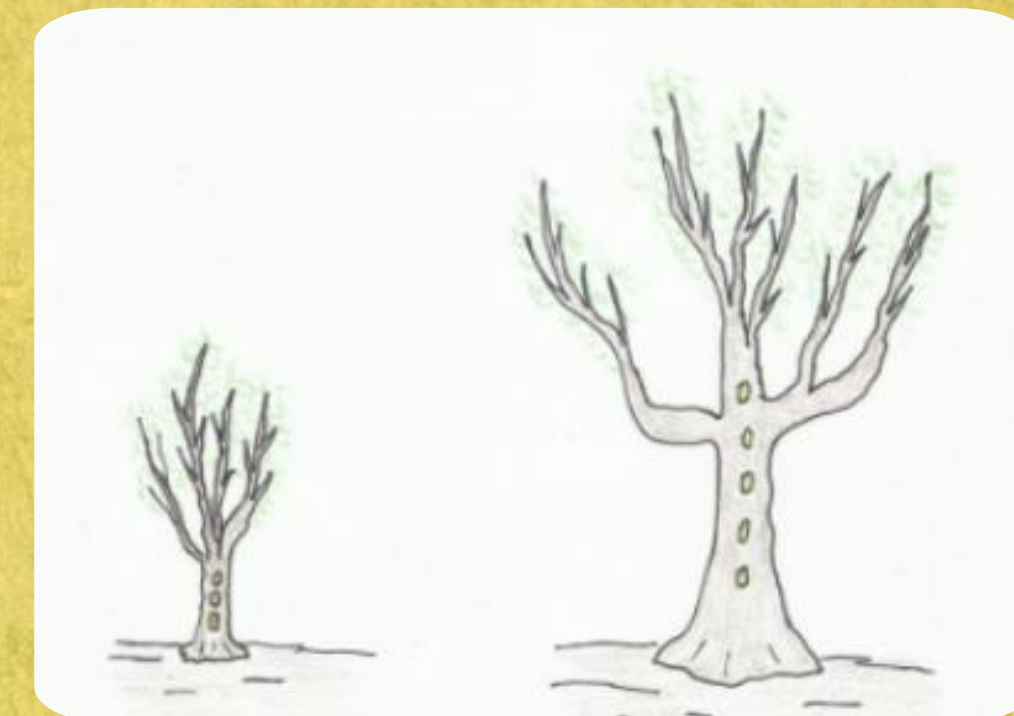
It is not advisable to prune the tree every year; it needs to rest. After pruning the tree for three years, it should rest for a year to recover from what was harvested

Year 1: Prune

Year 2: Prune


Year 3: Prune

Year 4: Rest – Do not prune




The number of cuts depends on the age and height of the tree.


