The illiberal nature of the UK's proposed import ban

The bill is not so much protectionist as it is illiberal – aimed not at protecting the UK's domestic hunting industry but rather reacting to a perceived national dislike to hunting foreign animals

The bill puts in place **illiberal measures** that are at odds with the UK's position UK as a member of WTO and a Party to CITES and the CBD and to its commitment to GBF









World Trade Organisation (WTO)



Recognizing that their relations in the field of trade and economic endeavour should be conducted with a view to... expanding the production of and trade in goods and services, while allowing for the optimal use of the world's resources in accordance with the objective of sustainable development ...

... by entering into reciprocal and mutually advantageous arrangements directed to the substantial reduction of tariffs and other barriers to trade...

An import ban undermines the role of export countries in CITES





An export permit shall only be granted when the following conditions have been met:

- (a) a Scientific Authority of the State of export has advised that such export will not be detrimental...
- (b) a Management
 Authority of the State
 of export is satisfied
 that the specimen was
 not obtained in
 contravention of the
 laws of that State...

RECOGNIZING that well-managed and sustainable trophy hunting is consistent with and contributes to species conservation, as it provides both livelihood opportunities for rural communities and incentives for habitat conservation, and generates benefits which can be invested for conservation purposes...

AGREES that the export of hunting trophies of species listed in Appendix I or II should be conditional upon issuance of an export permit in accordance with Articles III or IV of the Convention...



Hunting trophy import ban

- An illiberal trade measure undermines multilateral commitments to trade liberalisation and to ensuring that wildlife trade is sustainable and legal (WTO and CITES)
- An anti-conservation measure undermines multilateral commitments to mainstreaming the sustainable use and trade of wild species (CBD & GBF)
