I've moved between military development projects, disaster management and energy transition work within the research space, drawn to projects and people rooted in the complexities of development. My intellectual project is currently grounded in South Africa's energy transition.

Grounded first and foremost in research, I am committed to expanding the frontiers of knowledge emerging from the African continent because as the world becomes less predictable, more polycultured, requiring creativity and agility to navigate, there is much that the world can learn from Africa.

This emerging knowledge is then used to leverage action and grapple with the energy system through experimental interventions at muliple levels (from the individual to institutions to the wider system), drawing together invested actors, building more knowledge, and enabling learning, capacity building, and the agility to pivot as we learn.

- Researcher and project manager on energy projects within the CST's Just Energy Transition portfolio which aims to intervene in the energy system at multiple levels:
  - Lead and initiator of the Renewables-led Industrialisation research area which aims to understand upsteam industrialisation spurred on by a burgeoning renewables industry (2021 present). Has developed the renewables-led industrialisation research capability within the CST through 1) formalising partnerships with research institutes, across departments within Stellenbosch University and with professionals within the field, and 2) producing an exploratory report on localisation capacity in South Africa, 3) exploring and co-authoring reports on renewable energy technologies value chain localisation potential with the CSIR, and 4) collaborating with the SU Industrial Engineering Department to produce a research paper detailing the localisation potential of the wind value at the bill-of-materials level.
  - Research topic 1 lead for the Just Energy Transition Platform project (2023 2024) located at three national universities leading the research and thought leadership on the just transition. The project track aims to produce a commissioned research paper on *Dynamics of SA's Just Transition: from decarbonization to inclusive climate resilient development*, one public debate, one roundtable discussion, and one policy brief.

This project aims to study the shifting policy landscape for the energy transition, looking in particular at procuring renewables in a reformed supply industry.
