No timetable clashes will be negotiated, it would be the student's responsibility to maintain their participation in the course selected.

Department of Drama	Students need to submit course descriptions/outlines of theatre courses that were taken at their Home Universities that serve as pre-requisites.
Department of Social Work	Courses are not available to international students
Department of Sociology and Social Anthropology	Sociology 354 (Community Development) is NOT open to international students.
Department of Political Science	Students who apply for PG courses should have a minimum of 6 semesters prior knowledge in Political science or International Relations and a minimum of 65%
Department of Visual Arts	Students cannot combine and take courses from different year levels in departments. Only art students are given preference and these courses cannot be combined with other Arts and Social Sciences courses because of the specific timetable.

<u>Law</u>

UG students applying for PG courses must have had at least 6 semesters of Law studies at Home University

LLB electives applications subject to availability of space after full- degree students have applied. No preapplications. This only happens in the beginning of the semester once the full-degree students have applied/sign-up for these courses.

Corresponding course from Home University:

EGB371 Engineering Hydraulics

This is an intermediate level unit that provides knowledge on hydraulic principles and its application in engineering. The topics to be covered are: Units and properties of fluids, Forces in static fluids, Buoyancy, Kinematics and continuity, The energy equation and the momentum equation for real fluids, frictional flow in pipes, application of pipe resistance formulae, fitting losses, pump characteristics and selection and pipes, Network analysis, similitude and dimensional analysis and lift and drag. The knowledge gained in this unit will be further developed in an advanced level unit later in the course.

- Pressure and pressure measurement
- Forces in static fluids
- Buoyancy
- Kinematics, continuity and momentum equation
- The energy equation for ideal and real fluids
- Frictional flow through pipes

- Pipe network analysis
- Similitude and dimensional analysis
- Lift and drag
