 - Experience with supervision at Master's and Doctoral levels;
 - Expertise in two of the following five fields: Sociology of Race and Inequality, Public Sociology, Sociology of Education, Historical Sociology, and/or Sociology of Development
 - An existing international scholarly network, demonstrated by co-authorship, extended collaboration, or external examination;
 - Excellent communication skills;
 - A cover letter situating your research in relation to the Department's expertise and vision.

- Experience in organising scholarly activities: seminars, workshops and colloquia.
